 Stewart & Alex., Cap. Wigram came
 Home with us & staid all Night, Mr.
 Moore walk'd out in the evening and
 returned to Town at 10 O'clock

18. Fine clear morning, Rode to Town
 with Peter Wigram, din'd at Evans
 nothing particular occur'd. Nancy
 employ'd manning the Meadows, John
 & George cutting Wood
