17 A fine pleasant day, Mrs. Stewart, Mr. & Mrs. Wigman, Fanny & Rebecca Bowley and Mary Towson Dined with us, at 4 o'clock Mr. D. C. Stewart & Sam. Walker paid us a visit, with whom we took a walk, at 5 o'clock Mr. Harris, S. Herrett and Genl. Miller called upon us and sat an hour and half, when they all returned home, the evening was mild & very pleasant.
