28 - began to Reap Rye which is a very heavy clean crop, the Clover sown on it last Spring is very weak owing to dry weather and heavy Rye, a fine day
29 Sunday, A cloudy morning and very sultry, Mrs J. went to Church with the Furley Ladies, from thence to Furley to Dinner, I walked over with John Wm met there a large party, Messrs Hamilton, Harris, Miller, Holmes, Mr & Mrs Wiggman & Mr Moore after Dinner, the Gent^l called at Clifton on their way to Town, had 2 fine Showers

30th A sultry day, had a fine Shower at 7 o'clock, Cradled Barley in Orchard & busy cleaning Spring & walling it up with Stone
Walcoven & J. Chase ~~went~~ out & drank Tea & Petty with us
2nd Made Barley Stacks & began to cut Timothy in new meadow, the crop not very heavy owing to dry weather.
4 - Began to cut Oats, a very fine crop, was engaged to dine at Pecks to day but having a trifling Sore Throat declined going
5 - Made Rye Stacks & hauled into Stable Loft about 3 Tons of excellent Timothy Hay, Petty with us.
6 - Sunday - The Furley family, Mr & Mrs Wiggman dined with us, S. Sterrett & Ed^d Smith walked over in the evening, a pleasant day, had one Shower
