1812 Sunday 1st March - Very fine day, our Son Henry arriv'd on Tuesday last in the Ship William Wilson Cap. Hancock from Cadiz via Cape de Verde, he is in very good health & has not been indispos'd during the Voyage of 4 mo & 5 days, on Wednesday sent to Pomona for Bowly & John to meet their Brother, they came in the Gig with Fred^k and are very well

This day dined at Clifton D. A. Smith, Riggins, Galt, S. Sterett, Jas. Sterett, G. P. Wigram, Captains Gardner & Hancock, had a pleasant day

Mary & Fanny Bowly with W. Lux walk'd over this morning from Fuley but would not stay Dinner

Bowly & Henry rode with me to see Fortune I mark some Chestnut Trees for cutting, we call'd at Fuley

Mr. S. Hughes call'd this morning to see us, says Mrs Hall cannot live longer than this evening
