13 March - Fine day, took Sam to Town with me in the Gig & returned to Dinner, sold some N. Orleans Sugars which averaged \$12. J. Galt, nothing new -

Robt. Patterson & Dr. Bend call'd this evening at Clifton on a short visit - commenced Plastering new House, or rather new addition, & began putting up new Espaliers for the Grapes

14 - Wet disagreeable day. Wind N.E. went to Town, nothing new, dined at Mr. W's, returned Home by way of Fells Point, Clifton bending Tails & preparing for Sea, ask'd my Captains to Dinner tomorrow -

15. Sunday - Wet day, Wind still N.E. Captains Gardner, Chase, M. Meal and Davis came out to Dinner & P. Wingman call'd in the afternoon, very pleasant party. W. Lux also at Dinner. Fitzhugh's bow at Gen. Smith's.
