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9 May - Fine clear day & more Mild -
Went to Town, nothing new.

Rode up to Hampton at 12 O'clock,
a large Party collected to a Sheep Shearing
and to view the Farm which is in fine
condition, the Wheat & Clover look very
well - Merino Sheep in good condition,
the Shearers don't understand that busi-
ness like the English Shepherds.

Fifty one People sat down to Dinner
in the Hall I had plenty of Room,
returned Home with Sam^l. Bowley
at 1/2 past 8 O'clock.

10 May Sunday. Fine mild day, Wind S.
Staid at Home all day, & Nancy being
yet in Town, dined with Sam^l. Bowley.

upwards of three Hours, conversing
principally about the Times, and his
own distressed situation.
