Night & continued all this day -

Went to Town & returned to Dinner - Began Ploughing buck wheat in Ensors Field -

The carpenters finished new addition to Clifton this day -

June 17. Fine morning & cool Wind S.W. - Went to Town, returned to Dinner -

Began another Stack of clover - A heavy Shower of Rain at 7 O'clock in the evening & high Wind for one hour - 18 - Fine day & cool, went to Town & returned to Dinner -

Mrs. Beasley, Mrs. Jas. Williams and Anne Peters paid Mrs. J. a morning visit.

Busy with clover Stack & Hoing Corn.

19 - Cool morning but Hot at Noon, went to Town & returned to Dinner, Mrs. Bowly & Fanny Dined with us & drank Tea -

Sent to Town for the evening Paper which contains a Declaration of War against England, passed yesterday at Washington -

20 - Fine day, went to Town and dined with S. Steelt, after which took a boat & went below the Fort to meet the Balize, which arrived in safety & all well from New Orleans -
