Another Mob last night, unrig'd 3 Ships -

25 June, Fine clear day Wind N. W.
Went to Town, nothing new, return'd
to Dinner, Mrs Wingman, Beckey & Peter
also Doct.^r Crawford & Mr. Birch of
Phila.^a Din'd with us en-famille,
a very pleasant day -

The Signal which was hoisted for
the Clifton on 22nd Ins.^t prov'd incorrect,
& she has not yet arriv'd -

26 - A fine day, went to Town &
return'd to Dinner -

Two Bricklayers wall'd up James
& laid the hearths, in two new
Rooms, chang'd \$6 -

Mrs J. din'd at Furley with
two Mrs Wingmans -

27 - Went to Town, din'd at Col. Hindmans,
bro't out Beckey Peters in my gig -
at 6 o'clock the most severe Thunder
Storm & Rain I ever saw for 2 hours.
