three Miss Peters with Mr. Smith came &
drank Tea, Mr. Moore came out to
stay all Night - Cloudy ev. 7

26 - Fine clear day, went to Town,
dined at Mr Gadsbys in company with
Jas Sanderson -

Commenced digging Potatoes, of which
I have a very fine crop, in about
1/2 Acres of ground I expect 300 bu^l
