British Fleet arrived near Annapolis.

14th - Clear'd up this morning with

Wind at West - Went to Town

and took my Troop across Hammond's

Ferry, to the South end of Quaker

Creek, dined with Mr. In. C. Dorsey

at the Tavern, were hospitably

treated by him, returned at Sun-

-set after a ride of near 20 Miles.

15th - Very fine day, went to Town,

dined at S. Sturte's.

Our Boys came home from Pomona

to spend Easter Holydays, they are

all very well.

Rebecca Peters went home to day.

16th - Fine day, dined at Mr. Wiggan's,

at 3 o'clock alarm guns were fired, an-

nouncing the British to be in the River.

The 3rd Brigade instantly assembled, but

were dismissed in the evening.
