saw 3 British Ships & a Brig at Anchor.

22nd Fine day & cool, wind N. W.

23rd severe Thunder Storm at 10 o'clock
this morning, & Rain all day, went
to Town & dined at S. Streets —

24th Cloudy morning, but cleared
up at 12 o'clock very mildly, went
to Town & dined with P. Wignman
off Mutton Chops from the French
Cookes. — Mrs. T. & Mrs. Wignman

went to Town & returned to Dinner —
