21st Showery & Warm day -

Went to Town, dined at Mr. Nicols -

Mrs Wm Hollins & Miss Sarah came
out to spend a few days with us -

Had five Mowers at work -

and cool - even in evening,

dined with Mr. Talcott at Barneys -
