12<sup>th</sup> Fine day, went to Town, return'd to Dinner, after which Jas<sup>h</sup> Strett & Jacob Hollingsworth rode out & staid Tea - Augusta Strett dind with us also Beckey Peters -

In the ev<sup>g</sup> Mrs Brown with two Sons & three daughters also Mrs Hunter walk'd over & sat an Hour with us -

13 - Fine day, went to Town, return'd to Dinner -

14 - Hot & sultry, In<sup>o</sup> Brown rode with me to Town & we return'd to Dine, Mrs J. - walk'd to Mr Peters, A<sup>o</sup> Strett & Anne Peters call'd & staid all Night -
