Went to Town, dined at S. Steretts -
Paid Frederick Johnson in full to this day & Tho^s Johnson Jr. \$5 on acc^t -

27 March - Sunday - A Shower of Rain at sunrise, but afterwards an uncommonly fine Spring day and very warm, the Thermometer as high as 74 in a Shade.

Dined at home without company, afterwards rode to Furley & Fortune -

Wm R. Smith & Jn^o Menyan called -

28th Very fine day, went to Town, returned to Dinner -

Sowed 10 bushels of Oats on about 10 Acres of Meadow at Furley -

29 - Cool raw day Wind N. E. - went to Town returned to Dinner -

Sowed 1 1/2 bushels of clover Seed on ground sown yesterday in Oats -
evening wind north -
