

20th Feb 1815 - Very mild day, the Frost leaving us Roads very bad -
Becky & Ann Peters came to breakfast
& returned immediately -

Went to Town, dined with D. A. Smith.
Jacob arrived with 2 Horses from Philad^a -

21 - Mild day but cloudy & some Rain -
Went to Town returned to Dinner -

22 - Rain nearly all last Night, which
changed to Snow in the morning, and
continued all day without ceasing -
Having taken more cold, remained at
Home with a Sore Throat -

23 - Cold cloudy day - Wind N. E. -
Throat a little better, remained at
Home all day - Snow 3 Inch deep -
Miss Merion walked to Town -

24 - Extremely disagreeable day. Wind N. E.
Alternately raining or Snowing all day -
Throat better but did not go to Town -

25 Weather still worse, Rain all night &
continues this morning, which Freezing
upon the Snow, gives an appearance of an
unbounded Sheet of Ice, the Trees are
also enclosed in Ice & look beautiful -

Ceased raining at 12 O'clock, but still cloudy
26th Sunday - Frost last Night, but the
morning is beautiful & mild -

S. Herrett, D. A. Smith & P. Wignman dined
with us, & afterwards Mr. Nichols & H. Moore
rode out -

27th Cloudy day & thawing. Wind S. E. -
Went to Town, dined at P. Wignmans -

Mrs J. also went to Town and
dined with Mrs Bowly, brot out in the
ev. 9 J. Bowly & P. Maroney -
Commenced raining at Sunsett -
