& Geo & Wm Howard call'd in the evening.

24th Clear, cold day - Wind N. W.

Went to Town, returned to Dinner.

S. Skerett & H. Boutenay call'd in the ev.

25 - Clear & cool - Wind S. E.

Went to Town, returned to dinner.

26 - Weather continues cool & clear, Wind S.

Went to Town, returned to Dinner and
bro't out Miss Meroney.

27 - Fine day & more mild, went to Town
returned to Dinner, bro't out F. Bowly
to stay a few days.

28 - Warm, sultry day, Went to Town &
returned to Dinner. News arriv'd to
day that Buonaparte has returned to
France & again seated on the Throne
without opposition, Soldiers in his favor.
