The interest from the Fair Hill Fund, paid to us by order of the Yearly Meeting, has discharged nine hundred dollars of the indebtedness incurred last year, leaving with the expenditures of the present year a balance due us of five hundred and fifty four Dollars and eighty four Cents which will be paid out of the next interest money received from said source -
