A Memorial of Fairfax Monthly Meeting, approved by Fairfax Quarterly Meeting, for our deceased Friend, Nathan Waker, was received from the Representative Committee, and was read and approved, and directed to be returned to that Committee for recording.

The clerk is directed to have a copy of it appended to our printed Extracts.

The names of the members appointed to constitute a Representative Committee for this Yearly Meeting were handed to Women's Meeting, and those appointed by their Meeting, were now received and read.

Having been favored, during the deliberations of this Yearly Meeting to witness the overshadowing Presence of the Divine Father to prevail in our assemblies, under whose influence we have been enabled to transact the important concerns which have claimed our attention in much harmony and brotherly love.

Our hearts were tendered in gratitude to the Giver of all Good for the favor.
