

1876 to a future sitting - in conjunction with a Committee of Women Friends - the names of suitable Friends to serve in this capacity.

The minutes of the Representative Committee were laid before the meeting and read, and the action of that body approved, and they are encouraged to persevere in their endeavors to further the interests of peace between Nations, and the settling of all International difficulties by arbitration instead of the resort to physical force. The clerk was directed to hand the Minutes of the Representative Committee to the clerk of Women's Meeting. Then adjourned to 3 o'clock this afternoon.

Fifth Day Afternoon.

Near the time adjourned to, Friends assembled. The Standing Committee, having charge of the Investment of the "Fair Hill Fund" made the following report, which was satisfactory:

To the Yearly Meeting now sitting:
The Committee on the "Fair Hill Fund" report: That the receipts from our investments, with \$40. returned by a member of Nottingham Insurer, amounts to \$1,102.63. The expenditures by drafts made upon our Treasurer by the Disbursing Committee of this fund and taxes, amount to \$1,362.68, the difference being paid from the accumulated interest.

We would suggest for consideration, to be acted upon, we hope, at our next Yearly Meeting, that the Educational Committee of this meeting be encouraged to endeavor to establish within our borders a school in which children of both sexes may receive a plain, practical education, combining use of muscle with a development of mind, at an expense that could be borne by a large majority of our members.
