To the Yearly Meeting now sitting:

The Standing Committee, to disburse the income of the Fair Hill Fund for Educational purposes, report.

During the last year we have aided nine schools, with an expenditure of \$608.11. besides this, ten individuals have received aid, amounting to \$439.77. Some of these are preparing themselves for teachers, and some of them expect to refund a part or all of the money received. In the

1881 Schools aided there were 138 children of Friends, and most of them were under the care of Monthly or Preparative Meetings, and were taught by members of our Society. The total expenditure of money for the year has been \$1,047.88, a little more than the income of our Fund, which was drawn from the accrued interest. No money has been refunded during the year.

Elizabeth M. Sutton, a member of this Committee, having deceased since our last report, we propose that Mary M. Townsend be appointed to fill the vacancy.
