28 The Standing Committee appointed to disburse the "Fair Hill Fund for Educational Purposes" made the following report, which was read, and was satisfactory to the meeting.

The Standing Committee to disburse the income of the Fair Hill Fund for Educational purposes, report.

During the past year we have expended, within the limits of our several Quarterly Meetings, the sum of \$752.00, in aid of nine schools, in which there were 131 children of Friends. In addition to this, five pupils were aided in other schools, one of whom was preparing for a teacher. Total number of pupils aided 131. All but one of the schools were taught by Friends, and five of them were under the care of Monthly or Preparative Meetings.

One who drew on the fund a few years ago, and who has since been engaged in teaching, has refunded \$10.00, and another Friend has refunded \$85.00 making a total of \$95.00 refunded during the year. This added to the regular income of the fund, with the balance on hand at last report, gives us \$1564.26 from which deducting the amount expended leaves a balance on hand of \$812.26.

All applications for aid have been met, but the expenditures have been less than usual.
