To the Yearly Meeting now sitting:

The Standing Committee to disburse the income of
the Fair Hill fund, for educational purposes, reports:

During the past year we have expended within the
limits of our several Quarterly Meetings the sum of \$1108.60
in aid of 11 Schools in which there were 165 children of
Friends. In addition to this, 5 individuals have received

1884. aid to prepare them for teaching. Total number of children aided
170. All but two of the Schools were under the care of Monthly
or Preparative Meetings, and of the 25 teachers employed, 16
were members.

The disbursements have exceeded the income from invest-
ments \$82.00, but there has been refunded during the year \$85.00
and \$20.00 was refunded last year which was accidentally
omitted from the report, making a total of \$105.00 to report
now.

Seneca P. Broomell, a member of this Committee,
having removed to Baltimore, leaves Nottingham Monthly
Meeting without a representative on the Committee and
we would suggest that the Yearly Meeting fill the
vacancy thus created.
