

1890 The Clerks are now directed to have two thousand copies of the
 41 proceedings of our Branch, together with the Minutes of Women's
 Publishing Meetings, the Memorials read at this time, the Epistles received from
 of other Yearly Meetings, Extracts from the Minutes of the Representative
 Minutes Committee and such other matter as the Committee may determine,
 printed for the use of our members.

The Treasurer is directed to forward these to the correspondents
 or other proper representatives of our monthly meetings as heretofore
 and to pay the bills for printing and distributing the same, when
 such shall have been approved by the Committee on Revision
 and Printing.

42 The Clerks informed that they knew of no other business to
 occupy the further attention of the meeting. Information was
 received from Women's Meeting that they had nothing further
 to communicate to us.

43 It is now ordered that the newly appointed members of the
 Representative Committee be convened immediately after the
 adjournment of this session, for the purpose of effecting an
 organization and for the transaction of such matters of business
 as may properly be brought before them for consideration.

44 To those Friends of other Yearly Meetings, who have been with
 us in our deliberations from day to day, we feel it right to say
 their gospel labor and kindly words of sympathy have been
 encouraging and helpful to us and we are assured that the bonds
 of Christian fellowship and brotherly love have been strengthened
 between our Body and those Yearly Meetings to which they belong.

45 During the several sessions that we have been permitted to
 Closing assemble in a Yearly Meeting capacity, we have been made
 Minutes sensible that the spiritual presence of the Most High has been
 around us and over us; under covering of which we have been
 favored to transact the temporal affairs of the Church with entire
 harmony and brotherly affection, and now, with a fervent aspiration
 for the present and eternal welfare of all who are gathered here,
 we adjourn, again to assemble next year, if such ordering on

1890 our part merit the sanction of the Divine Will.
