The applications for aid since our last Yearly Meeting have been six for schools, Report of and two as loans for assistance in obtaining an education, Educational which were granted, aggregating \$460.00, but as there were some appropriations unpaid at our last Yearly Meeting, the Total amount distributed from the Fund during the year has been \$785.00. We feel that good results are accruing from the benefit of this Fund, and only regret, that it is not larger, that we might aid more efficiently, the education of those who are not in condition to help themselves.

Written reports were received from Thewood School at Sandy Spring, Maryland, Rising Sun and Brick Meeting House, Maryland, and of a Select School at Oxford, Pennsylvania, also verbal reports from Schools at Lincoln, Virginia, at Park Avenue, Baltimore, Blunnings Creek and Menallen, Monthly Meeting, Pennsylvania, all of which give an encouraging report of the interest taken in the different localities.

The General Committee on Education has received no communications from neighborhoods, as to the needs of schools and therefore, no work on that line has been done, but we would recommend if such needs exist, that they apply during the year, to the members of the Committee in their respective Monthly Meetings.
