A. Memorial from Mcnallen Monthly
 Meeting, in Pennsylvania, concerning Abel
 Thomas.

A. S. Memorials of the faithful
 when deceased may afford encouragement to sur-
 vivors to follow their pious examples, we are enga-
 ged to give this short Testimony concerning our
 esteemed Friends Abel Thomas.

He removed with his family & settled within
 the verge of this meeting in the year 1801. being
 by Eceter Monthly meeting recommended a minister
 in which station he laboured as a faithful servant
 of Jesus Christ, and having been taught in the
 School of Christ. He was often favoured like the good
 scribe to bring forth out of the Treasury things both
 "New and Old" and under the influence of his Hea-
 venly Master was enabled to preach the Gospel,
 "not with enticing words of man's wisdom, but in
 demonstration of the spirit and of Power", appearing
 cautious not to presume to speak without abundance
 of necessity being laid upon him. He was often
