He expired on the 17th in great quietude, in his Eightieth Year: a Minister upwards of Fifty Years.

A Memorial of Hopewell Monthly Meeting in Virginia, (in unity with the Ancient Yearly Meetings of Friends) concerning Jonas. Amey.

This our beloved friend was born in Loudon County, Virginia, in the Year 1749: his Parents being Members of the Society, ~~in~~ ^{and} ~~therefore~~ he was educated a Friend.

He stood long in the station of an Elder of Goose Creek Monthly Meeting, adorning his profession by a blameless life towards Man, and a becoming zeal for the support of our Christian Testimonies, and of the inestimable truth and principles of the Gospel of Christ, which he found by a blessed experience, to be the power of God unto salvation.

About the Year 1817, or 1818, he was brought under a deep exercise on account of the pernicious doctrines of Elias Hicks and his adherents, and remarked to his family that the time was, when Elias Hicks would have been brought to account by the proper authority in the Church for promulgating them.
