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The Testimony of Nottingham &
Little Britain Monthly Meeting
concerning our Friend Thomas
Waring deceased.

"The memory of the just is blessed.
Thomas Waring son of Joseph & Mary
Waring of the County of Wexford
Ireland, was born on the 10th of
the 12th month 1754.

His parents were members of
the Society of Friends and he
has been heard to recur with
much pleasure to the tender-
ing effect of their religious
care upon his mind and es-
pecially to those impressions
which he received during
times of religious reading in
their collected family, the re-
membrance of which could not
be effaced.

In early life he was much
exposed to hurtful company

not having had associates educa^{ted}
ted in the principles of Truth as
professed by Friends. The use of
the plain language subjected
him to the scoffs and sneers of
his thoughtless companions
and yet through the convictions
of the Spirit of Truth, he was
early led into a belief that it
was right for him to take up
the cross in this respect. He
believed that if he did not
submit to use the plain lan-
guage to all, he would cease
to grow in religious experience.
When he gave up faithfully to
this requisition great was
his peace.

In the year 1775 he removed
with his parents, brother and
three sisters to America. After
sometime he settled in that
is now Cecil County Maryland
first at East & afterward perma-
nently at West Nottingham.
