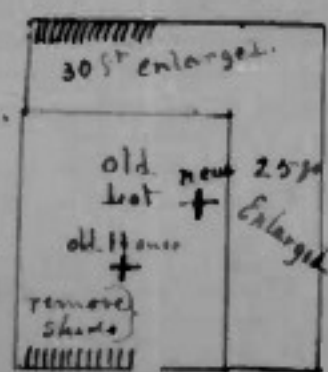
They also instructed their correspondents to urge immediate action, as most of the hauling could be done this winter before spring work commences.

At a meeting of the Sec. Creek Committee for "The promotion &c" to whom is given the power of proposing, building, & repairing Meeting Houses, when required, met at the house of Newlin Smith on the evening of the 27th inst.

There was a full attendance of the Com^o & entire unanimity of feeling prevailed.
