The Clerks to furnish the Quarterly and Monthly meetings with a copy of this Minute.

We have gratefully to acknowledge that we have been favoured to transact the many weighty and important concerns which have come before us since the sitting on the 30th of the month with harmony and unity and under a sense of the Mercy and Goodness of the Lord to us. The meeting concluded.

It must next Year if so permitted on second Day the 19th of the 10th Month and the meetings for ministers and Elders on the 7th day preceding.

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At a Yearly Meeting of Friends held in Baltimore for the Western Shore of Maryland and the adjacent parts of Pennsylvania and Virginia by adjournments from the 19th of the 10th Month to the 29th of the same inclusive 1829.

No Reports were received at this time from Warrington and Fairfax Quarterly Meetings, but several of the members of these Meetings were acceptably present with us.

Minutes were produced by several Brethren and Sisters attending this Meeting, from within the limits of Philadelphia and New York Yearly Meetings, which were read; and Nicholas Potholm and Thomas Waring were appointed to unite with a Committee of Women Friends in preparing a suitable Essay of Endorsement to be placed on them and produce it to a future sitting.
