on this Continent had approved and adopted the Testimony prepared by the
Committees who met in general Conference in Philadelphia in the
Seventh Month last year and that Five hundred Copies ordered for the
use of this meeting have been received. The Committee who stand
appointed in relation to the meetings and members composing the
Yearly meeting were ^{directed} ~~appointed~~ to take charge of the distribution
thereof. They were also desired to procure Five hundred additional
Copies for the same purpose & call on the Treasurer for the amount
of Expense incurred.

The Committee appointed at a former sitting to prepare a suitable
copy of endorsement to be placed on the certificates of members
of Sisters attending from within the limits of other Yearly Meetings
produced one which was approved & the Clerk was ^{accordingly} directed to unite
with the Clerk of Women's Meeting in endorsing them on behalf of this
Meeting.

The meeting taking into consideration the time for holding its next annual
Session it was concluded to meet on the last second day in the Tenth
Month at 10 o'clock in the Morning and the Meeting of Ministers and Elders
the Seventh Day proceeding at the same hour & so to continue until other-
wise directed by the Meeting.

Then adjourned to 3 o'clock Tomorrow afternoon.

Then adjourned to 10 o'clock Tomorrow Morning

22nd of the Month and 6th of the Week.

Yearly Meetings of Friends on the Continent, also to that held in London which
were read & after some alteration approved directed to be transmitted signed forward
