Virginia produces the following report which was acceptable to the
Meeting; & as it appears that the members composing that body are
still desirous that we should continue our brotherly regards towards
them the same friends were continued to attend their next Yearly Meeting
To the Yearly Meeting now sitting:

The Committee continued last year to attend the late yearly meeting held
in Virginia report:

That part of their number attended that meeting which was
also attended by diverse friends under a similar appointment from
the yearly meeting of North Carolina and notwithstanding the many
close trials & discouragements to which friends there are sub-
jected especially by the removal of a number of their members
the meeting was held, & the business thereof transacted in much
harmony & regularity & to the satisfaction of those assembled.

On a solid conference on the subject by a large Committee of the
meeting of men & women friends, & those appointed by the neighbor-
ing Yearly Meetings with several valuable friends from a distance
it resulted in the conclusion & with much unanimity that it would
be right to continue that Yearly Meeting - still soliciting the
continuance of the Christian regard & assistance of this Yearly
Meeting & the Yearly Meeting of North Carolina; That the
meeting be held in future alternately at Cedar Creek & Somerton
on the third Sabbath Day in the Fifth Month & for the next time
at Cedar Creek

report which was read as also minutes of the proceedings
of the Committee for the past year: They were satisfac-
tory to the Meeting & the Committee were continued to the service

Indian Concerns

The Committee on Indian Concerns report
That soon after the yearly meeting last year our attention was directed to
the importance of procuring & placing on record a summary of the
several reports heretofore made to the yearly meeting by the Committee
on Indian Concerns we have the satisfaction to state that we are
in possession & have recorded in a book provided for the purpose
a summary & in a number of instances the entire reports made to
the meeting from the year 1776 to the year 1826 inclusive with
the exception of the years 1800 1801 1817 & 1818

In the 12th month
last several Indian Chiefs of the Shawnee nation passed through this
City on their way to Washington accompanied by Henry Harvey
the Superintendent at Friend's Station at Woughpauktonetta
& David Bailey a member of the Committee on Indian Concerns
of Indiana Yearly Meeting. In a conference with the Chiefs
& the friends above named we ascertained that they were
dissatisfied with the provisions of a Treaty made with
the agents of the General Government for the cession
of their lands at Woughpauktonetta & for their removal
beyond the Mississippi & that they were about to apply to the
Government for redress in the case, & their return finding
that the object of their visit had not been accomplished dur-
ing their stay in Washington & the Committee feeling a lively
interest in the justice of their claim for additional compensation
for their lands, appointed a Sub Committee to aid the Chiefs
in every way in their application to the General
Government: From the friends appointed to this service
or also from their correspondence with the Committee of this
Yearly Meeting we are informed of the Ratification of the Treaty
& that subsequently an act was passed by Congress granting
to the Indians under notice 2000 \$ per annum for
15 years as an additional compensation to them
for their lands so ceded to the United States.
