Epistles of Correspondence from the yearly Meetings of
Friends held in London, Dublin, Rhode Island (for New England),
New York, Philadelphia, Virginia, Carolina, Ohio, and Indiana
were received and read in this Meeting to our comfort and satis-
faction.

The printed General Epistle from our Brethren of the yearly
Meeting held in London, was received and read: and with a
view that its interesting contents may become more generally
diffused among our members, the Meeting concluded to have
500 copies thereof re-printed for distribution. Joseph Townsend &
George Williamson were appointed to attend to the printing
and call on the Treasurer for the amount of expense incurred.

Certificates and Minutes were produced by several brethren &
sisters attending this Meeting, from within the limits of neighbour-
ing Yearly Meetings, who with their company were acceptable
to us: and Nicholas Pippin and Thomas Waring were appointed
