

& linen for the girls of the school now on hand, but the boys clothes will have to be furnished some other way. We think Sears can be got here almost as cheap as in Ohio. The labors of the farmer have been crowned with plenty the present year. We have 40 acres of corn which look very well; our harvest is now finished. We had the present year about 1630 dozen of wheat, 174 of rye & about 1600 of Oats, all of good quality. The wheat & rye have been threshed & the rye cleaned up & produced 120 bushels. We have sowed 4 acres of buckwheat, which is up: we have 4 or 5 acres in potatoes & other vegetables all of which are very promising. There are also about 2 tons of good timothy hay; the clover that was sowed last winter, entirely failed in account of dry weather.

The Report also informs that Rich^d Mendenhall & Sarah Ann Nixon expected to leave the establishment about the first of the 7th month last. A Com^{tee} was therefore set apart to select others to fill their places.

From the above it will appear that the prospects of our Institution are as favorable as they have been at any previous time. The new buildings are completed. The Indians appear to appreciate the efforts that are being made to improve their condition & the children are well behaved & attentive.

The present contributions of the Balt^e, Ohio & Indiana Yearly Meetings appear sufficient after supplying the wants of the establishment, to afford a small surplus to be devoted to the extinguishment of the debt. Yearly \$350 have been so applied the past year. Ohio Yearly Meeting has this year made an addition of \$100 to the annual subscription having directed \$400 to be raised. Indiana Yearly Meeting has again directed the sum of \$1000 & we propose that the

sum of \$150 be directed as our quota this year.
