The following Report of our Committee on Indian Concerns was produced, read, and being considered, is approved. The Committee is continued to the service - and our Subordinate Meetings are directed to raise the ensuing year the sum of one Hundred Dollars therein named, and pay it over to the Treasurer of the Committee.

To the Yearly Meeting now sitting;

The Committee on Indian Concerns Reports: That through the Acting Committee of Indiana Yearly Meeting, they are enabled to offer the following satisfactory account of our establishment among the Shawnee Indians:

It is gratifying to learn that the plan recommended by this Committee some years since, and adopted by the several Yearly Meetings immediately interested in the concern of increasing the sum of their annual subscriptions to such an amount as to constitute a sinking fund, has, with the aid of our Friends of London, New England and New York, not only enabled the Committee to pay the heavy debt then due by the establishment, but, also, very much to improve and enlarge the accommodations for the family. The number of those who have enjoyed the benefits of the Institution the past year has been very considerably increased. Fifty-six Indian children have had the opportunity of religious and literary instruction. Their first-day school has been regularly kept up, and the children guided in Scripture questions, Reading, Catechism, &c. Meetings for worship are regularly held, and attended by the whole family when in health; and the children are said to behave with becoming propriety. It is stated that thirty of the children can read the Scriptures; and it is added, they seem more interested in reading them than in any other book. Most of the above referred to, can
