Crenshaw, William A. Thomas, John P. Balderson, Robert S. Smith, Richard H. Thomas, Ely B. Hayward, Francis S. King, Bond Valentine, Hugh Balderson, Thomas Worthington, Aaron C. Griffith, John Scott, and Jesse Hoge. The representatives are directed to confer together at the close of this sitting and agree upon two Friends, to serve this Meeting as Clerk and Assistant Clerk, also two Friends to act as messengers to our women's

Meeting, and report at the opening of the next sitting.

Then adjourned to 3 o'clock this afternoon.

About the time adjourned to Friends assembled. Hugh Balderson, on behalf of the Representatives, reported that they had conferred together, and had agreed to propose Richard H. Thomas, for Clerk, and Bond Valentine, for Assistant Clerk; also Samuel Worthington, and William A. Thomas, for messengers to the women's Meeting, which being considered, is approved, and they^{are} appointed to those services.

The printed General Epistle from London was now read, and to the end that our absent Members and others may participate with us in the edification and comfort which it imparts, it was concluded to have 500 copies thereof reprinted for distribution, and Thomas R. Mather and Francis S. King, are directed to attend to the same and call upon the Treasurer for the cost.

With the Epistle from Dublin Yearly Meeting, was received "An Epistle of Tender Counsel to Friends in England, from the Committee separated by the Yearly Meeting, held in Dublin, in 1850, to visit the Quarterly and other Meetings belonging thereto," which was now read to our comfort and satisfaction, and in order that it may be circulated among our Members and others, it is concluded to have 500 copies reprinted for distribution, and Thomas R. Mather and Francis S. King, are directed to have the same attended to and call upon the Treasurer of the Yearly Meeting for the expense. Francis S. King, on behalf of the Committee to record the Minutes of the Meeting last year, reported that the same had been attended to. They are continued to record the Minutes of the present year, and report to next Yearly Meeting.

The following named Friends are appointed to examine and settle the Treasurer's accounts, report the state of the stock, and the sum necessary to be raised the ensuing year: Aaron H. Then adjourned to 10 o'clock to-morrow morning.
