The Committee Continued last year to Confer with Committees of other Yearly Meetings, (who might see their way to appoint them) and unite in laboring as way opened for it, for the restoration of love and unity and for other services as set forth in the Minute made on that occasion, produced the following report which was read, — and inasmuch as it appears the services assigned the Committee have not been accomplished, they are again Continued and authorized to meet in Conference the Committees of other Yearly Meetings who have or who may make similar appointments and report to the Yearly Meeting next Year.

To Baltimore Yearly Meeting.

A part of our Committee attended the late Philadelphia and Ohio Yearly Meetings, with a copy of a Minute from our Yearly Meeting, together with a copy of the "Address to Friends," prepared by the Associated Committee and adopted by our Yearly Meeting.

Our Minute was presented and read and the right of one Yearly Meeting to address another, and present an address through a Committee fully acknowledged; also the obligation resting upon the Yearly Meeting to address to read the Communication if prepared by the Yearly Meeting addressing it; but it was Contended in the present instances, as the address had been only adopted by the Yearly Meetings, they were not bound to read it at its request: after Considerable discussion in both Philadelphia and

314 Ohio Yearly Meetings, it was Concluded not to read it — no Minutes were made of our attendance, of of the reading of the Minute, and the same Course ^{was} pursued in regard to the deputation from our friends in North Carolina (in Philadelphia Yearly Meeting) who were there with a similar Minute, and the same Course pursued in regard to our Indiana friends (in Ohio Yearly Meeting).
