McCoy, were appointed to examine and settle the Treasurer's account,
report the state of the stock and the sum necessary to be raised the
ensuing year, and report to a future sitting.

The following proposition from our brethren of Indiana
Quarterly Meeting was read and seriously considered by us.

"The state of our beloved Society throughout the Continent has
at the time claimed our serious consideration. — We have been
brought to mourn over the injuries that have been heaped upon us, and
the disunity that exists in portions of our beloved Society; and a
proposition has been laid before the Meeting for the appointment of
a Committee to unite with Committees that may be appointed by other
Quarterly Meetings, to deliberate on and settle, in the authority of truth,
all difficulties affecting the welfare of the Church, that may be referred
to them by any of the Quarterly Meetings, or which may affect with
suffering the brotherhood of Quarterly Meetings, which was united with
by the Meeting, and a Committee appointed accordingly."

It was concluded to refer the whole subject to the following
Committee, who were directed to report to a future sitting, viz.
Bond Valentine, Geo. King, Jr., Isaac Scott, Richard H. Thomas, Nath.
C. Cushman, William St. Thomas, Aaron H. Griffith, Abel S. Hopkins
and Chas. B. Hayward.

We are in receipt of an address from our Friends of
London Quarterly Meeting on the conduct of Christian nations towards
these less enlightened, issued by that Meeting, which is referred to our
Meeting for suffering.

Then adjourned to 10 o'clock tomorrow morning.
