

17. The reading of the Report of the "Baltimore Association to aid and advise our Brethren of North Carolina" awakened deep interest and feeling in the work, and the Association was encouraged to continue its labors and report to this Meeting next year.

We appoint the following Committee to call upon our members and solicit Subscriptions in aid of the cause, and report the sum raised to a future sitting of this Meeting, viz: M. Thompson, Milliken, Jonathan Dennis, Jr., and John C. Thomas. Our members were encouraged to make voluntary contributions to the education of the Freedmen as heretofore.

18. The following Report was received from the Committee to visit Subordinate Meetings; it was satisfactory to the Meeting, and the Committee was continued to report next year.

The Committee to visit Subordinate Meetings report: That a portion of their number visited Baltimore Quarterly Meeting, when held at Deer Creek, and appointed two meetings for public worship, which were held to satisfaction, also, the Monthly Meeting of Deer Creek and most of the families thereof; the Meeting at Monahan and Lookville, and most of the members of these Meetings, also the Meetings at Washington and Mountgomery, Dunning's Creek Quarterly Meeting, Centre Monthly Meeting, and the families thereof, the Meetings at Bellefonte, Dunning's Creek, and an appointed Meeting at Altoona. Virginia Half Year's Meeting in the 5th Month at Black Creek, near which place a public meeting was held to satisfaction, and again at Richmond, in the 10th Month, where most of the families were visited. In these various exercises the Committee imparted such counsel and advice as way opened for and ability was afforded, and we are not without hope that it may prove as broad cast upon the waters to be found after many days.
