

Social religious meetings among our members are held in five localities. Gospel meetings are maintained in two neighborhoods. There are reports to have joined our Society through our efforts - but an Independent Church organization has been formed in Baltimore as a result of Mission work, which numbers about 40. The members of this agree with Friends in our views on Baltimore & Upper - & regular Monthly Meetings for business are held, & three Gospel Meetings a week. The average attendance of the meetings on 1st day evenings has been from 40 to 50.

In one locality, a weekly bible-class on 1st-day evenings has been held by our members among members of another denomination for eight months with very good results.

All reports received show that there has been a great deal of work done in the cause of Temperance & in Union Gospel work, in many instances there has been great blessing resting upon these labors.

2. The following report from the Committee on the religious & educational interests of our meetings & members was read to our satisfaction, & the Committee was requested to report next year.

Religious & Educational Meetings.
Committee for promoting the Religious & Educational interests of our meetings & members, report that they have collected statistics of our various particular meetings - and that these show in several localities an increase in the attendance of our meetings on First-day evenings.

The new meeting house at Cuburnville has been finished at a cost of \$3500, of which all has been subscribed except about \$700.

The money was raised chiefly through

the exertions of our Friend Zachariah McDaniel. At the completion of the building, a General Meeting was held at Cuburnville, which was largely attended - since then the attendance at our Meeting on First-day morning has very much increased.

Very little money has been contributed or collected for Educational purposes - & we have again to express our obligations to the Mills & White Society for the education at West Town & Providence Boarding Schools of a number of our children the past year.

In two localities, Public Schools are about to be opened, which will be taught by Friends & attended by a number of Friends' children.

The Washington Meeting has been regularly kept up - The meetings maintaining their usual size.

The meeting at Deer Creek has been visited several times, Winchester twice also Washington, Caspersville, Bellefonte & D. D. State.

The Friends in Northampton County have been visited three times - & Virginia half-year meetings were attended in the 5th month.

We would recommend that the Committee be continued for further services, as we feel encouraged by the fact that there seems to be an increasing interest manifested among our members in the important branch of work in which we are encouraged.
