It resulted in a permanent educational organization of three departments, Eastern, Central, Western. The stimulus given to education in all the Yearly Meetings by the Conference is already very marked. Indiana and Western Yearly Meetings have already united in the management of Earlham College. Penn College, Iowa has paid off its debt, and our Colleges & boarding schools have opened this fall with an increase of students, & more

general effort in the cause of education.

We would propose that a Standing Committee on education be appointed by this Yearly Meeting to look after the educational interests of our members, and represent us in any general educational work of the Society.
