Minutes of Baltimore Yearly Meeting 1882

- 1 At a yearly meeting of Friends held in Baltimore, for the Western shore of Maryland, Virginia, and the adjacent parts of Pennsylvania, by adjournments from the 21st to the 26th of the 10th month, 1882.
- 2 By reports from the subordinate meetings, the Representatives to the Yearly Meeting were as follows viz: Baltimore Quarterly Meeting, — John Scott, Caleb Winslow, John C. Thomas, George S. Scott, Lewis N. Hoge, John Griffith, James A. Harried, and Rowland S. De Vol. Dunning's Creek — Zachariah McHaul, John Irons Jr. David T. Way Thomas McCoy, & David Fleming. Virginia's half year's Meeting — John B. Brushaw, Richard A. Ricko, Wm F. Terrell, Bessie White, James M. Bradshaw, and John Pritlow. Who were present except two.
- 3 Our beloved friend Isaac Sharp, a minister from England with a certificate from Darlington Monthly Meeting, dated 12th of 11th month, 1877, liberating him for religious service "in Cape Town and elsewhere in South Africa, in Madagascar, in Australia, Tasmania and New Zealand, and passing thence to California to engage in such service on the continent of North America as he may, in humble dependence on the Lord Jesus, feel to be his duty;" endorsed by Durham Quarterly Meeting held the 19th of 4th month, 1877; Also a certificate from the London Yearly Meeting on Ministry and Oversight held by adjournments on the 21st & 22nd of 5th month and the first of the 6th month, 1877, also liberating him for the same gospel service. All of these testimonials from his friends at home, express their full unity and sympathy with him in this important and weighty service.
- 4 Minutes were read for the following brethren and sisters in attendance from other Yearly Meetings, and we appointed Joseph Edge, Thomas McCoy, and John Pritlow, to unite with a similar Committee of Women Friends to prepare endorsements to be placed upon them, and produce them to a future sitting; viz: Joel Bean, of California, a minister from Iowa Yearly Meeting, companion to Isaac Sharp. Daniel Barker a minister from North Carolina Yearly Meeting. Jehu Newlin a minister from Western Yearly Meeting. Lancaster J. Morn a minister from North Carolina Yearly Meeting. Wm. Nicholson a minister from Ohio Yearly Meeting Sarah Ann Linton a
