24 The following report of the Committee on Indian affairs was read & the Committee was continued: our Treasurer was directed to pay to the Treasurer of the Associated Executive Committee the sum of \$100.

Indian Report.

To the Yearly Meeting:

The Committee on Indian Affairs report that they have acted as usual with the Associated Committee of Friends on Indian Affairs, and submit herewith their annual report.

The Associated Committee has held one meeting the past year at Lancaster in the fourth month last, but neither of our Committee was able to attend. As intimated in our last report, the Committee, at the request of the Commissioner of Indian Affairs, have named our friend Jacob V. Barker, to be Agent of the Sac and Fox Agency, and he is now in that service. The three Agents who are Friends have now 10,957 Indians under their care. Five Friends, with the wives of four of them, have been engaged in the religious instruction of the Indians. There are 150 Indian members of the Meetings under their care an increase of 42 over last year. The rapid diminution of the herds of buffalo will force the Indians to depend upon their own labor for subsistence, and the work of Friends among them is still needed. The Government is now favoring the placing of a certain number of Indian children from the different tribes into Industrial Schools located in the different States. By an arrangement with the White Manual Labor School under the care of Indiana Yearly Meeting, and located in the state of Indiana, that school hereafter will be devoted to the training of Indian children, and the Government has promised to send the children allotted to the State of Indiana to that school.
