The following is a brief outline of the Epistles from other Yearly Meetings.

London Friends have been cheered by the evidences in the epistles they received of the earnest work in which our Society is engaged. They prize the connective links which bind one Yearly Meeting to another. The report of their Home Mission work shows that there are abundant openings for all the energies of the Church, and that an increasing number of their members are giving themselves to the service of their Redeemer. They had encouraging reports from the Foreign Missions, in Madagascar, Syria, Constantinople, and India; so that, both at home and abroad, the work and the workers were prospering. They, however, felt their need of more of the converting, baptizing and controlling power of the Holy Spirit in all their Meetings, and of a more complete yielding of themselves to Him. Their Yearly Meeting had been well attended, and conducted in much brotherly love and condescension, and they could thankfully acknowledge the Lord's blessing.

Dublin Epistle speaks of the blessed unity of the children of God, and their prayer that love may abound, get more and more in knowledge and in all judgment. They rejoice in the manifest blessing in the labors of American Friends for the conversion of sinners, both in the home and foreign fields. They continue to urge their government to restrict the sale of intoxicants in Ireland, and especially to pass the Sunday Closing Bill. Many of their members have been engaged in Home Mission work, and some have been called into Foreign Mission service in distant lands.
