24 The following detailed and interesting Report from the Committee on Foreign Missions, with the Financial Report, appended, was read, and we encourage the Committee to further labor and direct them to report next year.

Report of the Committee on Foreign Missions

Our Committee has been able to continue the support of the School at Dar-Baleem, Mt Lebanon, and we have received most satisfactory reports of its condition from our friend Theophilus Waldmeier. In a recent letter he says: "The Dar-Baleem School, causes us much satisfaction and pleasure, indeed. It has become in such a short time one of our best schools, for which we are very thankful. The removal from Kabbareich was a change in the right direction, which was and is blessed by the Lord."

The liberality of our members has again enabled us to contribute five hundred dollars through the Foreign Missionary Committee of Indiana Yearly Meeting to the support of their Mission in Mexico. Their late Annual Report gives an encouraging account of the work in this field during the past year, and states that four new Meetings have been opened in their Southern district, as the result of a remarkable religious awakening in that section.

They express their gratification at the continued interest of Baltimore Friends in this work.

One very interesting public meeting was held in Baltimore last winter. An effort has also been made by short reports published each month in "The Interchange" to promote the interest in Foreign Missions throughout the Yearly Meeting, but we feel that this object is best secured by holding special meetings on the subject in the different localities. We regret that this has been impossible during the past year. Our Children's Bands are still kept up, and a new one has been formed at Ashton, called the "Pansy Society," which meets once a fortnight.
