Report of the Committee on Education.

The Educational Committee of Baltimore Yearly Meeting has endeavored, during the past year, to make its work more systematic and thorough than heretofore, and yet at the same time leave the actual duty of investigating their educational needs to the subordinate Meetings, in conformity with the decision of the Yearly Meeting of last year.
