2d. The following Report of the Baltimore Association of Friends to advise and assist Friends at the South was read and approved:

Report of the Baltimore Association of Friends to advise and assist Friends at the South.

At the date of our last report, the large academic building at New Garden had recently been destroyed by fire. Since then our association has aided North Carolina Friends in the preparation of plans and the raising of funds for the erection of two large, new brick halls, which are now finished and furnished, and fully occupied, giving the school much better accommodations, and a larger number of students than it ever had before. We rejoice in the promptness and liberality shown by North Carolina Friends and others in thus more than restoring the loss sustained by the fire of the previous year.

We also submit the final report of our disbursement of the fund originated by Stanley Pumphrey to aid in building new Meeting-houses in the South and on

the frontier. Although, owing to the small response from American Yearly Meetings, the fund did not reach the proportions we hoped, yet, by carefully reducing the amount granted to each Meeting-house to an average of about one sixth of the total cost, the benefits of the fund have been very widely distributed, as will appear from the following statement, and the summary of the whole work, appended thereto:
