

We need not fear that our Lord, whose love for souls is so intense, will lead us into quiescence or inaction. Some speak of the failure of Tuckermans who fail to be true friends themselves.

The Church is a body with a head, Christ Jesus, and a free Gospel ministry is known, where all are free to offer themselves, and do offer themselves to Him for service.

Such meetings would be a living testimony to the power of the present Lord, and those that minister would speak, baptizing the hearers into oneness with Father, Son, and Holy Spirit. The first requisite of true service is consecration. The history of our Church is the history of the individual faithfulness of its members. The exercise of the various gifts, which we believe all are intended to receive and edify, has enabled Friends in the past to adorn the doctrine of Christ our Saviour, and to win souls unto Him, and in this, consecrated and gifted women have always taken an important part.

We have been cemented together in love, by the Lord's dealings with us as a Church. In our unity is our strength. Let us continue to work together, and may His blessing rest upon the labor of the coming year!

The gift of prophecy is a distinct legacy to the Church from our ascended Lord, which should not be lost sight of in our day. "He gave some apostles; and some prophets; and some pastors and teachers; for the perfecting (or more literally, the thorough equipping) of the saints, in order to the work of the ministry, and in order to the edifying of the body of Christ." Not that there should be in the Church a few teachers, and many learners, but that all should come to such a knowledge of the Son of God that each might be thoroughly equipped to hand forth the word of truth to those around them.

An accurate knowledge of the words of Scripture is very important. All should study to show themselves approved unto God, workmen that need not be ashamed, rightly dividing the word of truth. Ministers should look to the

Great Head of the Church for guidance, as to the state of a meeting, or to the condition of individuals. They should be very careful to avoid any tone or manner, that in drawing attention to themselves might detract from the value and effectiveness of their message, and they should seek to yield all their powers to the Lord that He may make the best use of every natural gift to give force to the messages given them to deliver.
