

Federal Hill. (South Baltimore) - A three weeks series of meeting was held at Federal Hill, beginning on the 16th of First month. Caroline E. Talbot was in attendance throughout, and Elizabeth L. Comstock for the first week. Ministers and Workers from Cutaw Street Meeting also took part in the work, which was heartily entered into by the members at Federal Hill. The meetings were characterized by much solemnity and earnestness and the entire absence of excitement, and the power of the Lord was very manifest. Many professed conversion in the in the after meetings, about half of them young people between thirteen and seventeen years of age, chiefly scholars in the Mission First day School. Quite a number were received as associate members of the Mission Station. After this work the attendance of the regular meeting was doubled.

Washington. Washington Meeting has been visited six times by members of the Pastoral Committee from Baltimore. A member of the Yearly Meetings Committee from Richmond, and E. L. Comstock held an appointed meeting for the members in the Third month. The meeting was discontinued from the Seventh to the Tenth month. Since it has been re-opened, the outlook is more encouraging than heretofore.

Deer Creek. A series of meetings was held at Deer Creek in Twelfth month, lasting eight days. Elizabeth L. Comstock attended throughout and six members of the Yearly Meetings Pastoral Committee were in attendance for a day or two at a time. Much interest was awakened, and the Meeting was strengthened. A number of family visits were paid.

Caroline E. Talbot also visited this Meeting, holding several appointed meetings, and paying some family visits in the First month. Two members of this Committee visited Deer Creek in Fourth month. They attended the First day morning meeting, and had an appointed meeting that night, also a social meeting at a friend's house on Seventh day afternoon. Several members of the committee attended the Quarterly Meeting in the Sixth month.

Ashton. - Ashton has been visited seven times. A member of the Pastoral Committee visited the Meeting in Eleventh month 1886. In Fourth month 1887, three appointed meetings were held, several families visited, and two Bible readings given at private houses. In Fifth month ten members of the committee from Baltimore and one from Lincoln were at the opening of the Monthly Meeting, and two remained several days holding meetings and visiting families. In Seventh month two visits were paid by members of the committee and four appointed meetings held. C. E. Talbot also visited this Meeting in Eleventh month of this year.

Lincoln. - A three weeks series of meetings was held at Lincoln in the Eleventh and Twelfth months, 1886, during Caroline E. Talbot's visit to that neighborhood. A member of the Pastoral Committee from Baltimore was present on two First days. The meetings were largely attended, and much interest was manifested, a number were reached and brought to the knowledge of the forgiveness of their sins.

Four members of the Pastoral Committee visited Lincoln in First month, holding one appointed meeting and visiting families. One member visited the Meeting in Second month. A series of meetings was held in the Fourth month, beginning on the 23rd, and ending with the opening of the Monthly Meeting on the 12th, when several other members of the Pastoral Committee were present.

In Sixth month two members of the Committee visited Lincoln and held three appointed meetings. In the early part of Seventh month, one member of the Committee spent First day at Lincoln, and held one appointed meeting, and visited families. In the latter part of the same month three members of the committee spent several days in the neighborhood, attending the Monthly Meeting and visiting families. They also held one appointed meeting. Two members from Ashton also visited Lincoln for a First day in the Ninth month and held an appointed meeting.
