22 The Trustees of the Miles White Beneficial Society submitted their annual report of receipts and expenditures during the past year. They have distributed \$4.176 in a careful and judicious manner according to the provisions of the trust, as appears by the following statement:

 Dear Friends: The Trustees of the Miles White Beneficial Society, in conformity with its Act of Incorporation, submit the following statement of its operations for the past year.
 They have thought best to set aside annually an amount to offset the decline of premiums on securities held, as they mature; and to provide for the purchase of others in their stead; and accordingly have, during the past year, purchased \$500 of the Virginia Midland Railroad 4th series 5 per cent. bonds at a cost of \$506.25. Otherwise there has been no change made in the Investments.

Interest to the amount of \$5330 has been received, of which \$41.6 has been distributed, as follows: \$525 for Charitable objects, \$1070 for Educational purposes; and \$551 for the dissemination of Books and Tracts. The following is a detailed statement
