- 39 The Committee to propose the sum of money necessary to be raised the ensuing year for the use of this Meeting, &c., make the following report which was approved by the Meeting, and the subordinate Meetings were directed to raise their quotas therein named, and pay them to the Treasurer.

Isaac Brooks, Jr., was appointed Treasurer of the Yearly Meeting, and the Treasurer of Women's Meeting was directed to pay any unappropriated funds in her hands to him.

The Committee appointed to report the sum necessary to be raised the ensuing year recommend that \$200 be raised in the following proportions, viz., by Baltimore Quarterly Meeting 80 per cent., by Dunning's Creek Four Months' Meeting 10 per cent., and by Virginia Half Year's Meeting 10 per cent.

They unite in proposing Isaac Brooks, Jr. as the Treasurer of the Yearly Meeting, and recommend that the sum now in the hands of the Treasurer of the Women's Meeting be paid to him as the Treasurer of the whole Yearly Meeting, and that he give a detailed statement of receipts and expenditures at each Yearly Meeting.

- 40 The following interesting report from the Home Mission and Bible School Committee was read. We have approved their labors and have continued the Committee to report to the Meeting next year.

Report of Home Mission Committee.

The report of this Committee to the Yearly Meeting last year shows that while most of our Meetings were doing something in the Home Mission field, there were actually in existence then only three Associations for Home Mission Work. Our summary of answers to Queries sent out by the Committee this year will show that there are now seven Meetings which have regularly organized Associations.
